Kokotaylo reported that Governor Newsom announced the COVID-19-related state of emergency would come to an end on February 28, 2023. With the state of emergency ending, initiatives relying on the active state of emergency would cease to remain in effect including remote meetings that use the framework enacted by the passage of Assembly Bill 361 (R. Rivas, 2021). Kokotaylo then reported on Senate Bill 1439 that amends California Government Code Section 84308 to no longer exclude local government agencies whose members are directly elected by the voters from accepting campaign contributions of over \$250 from contractors.
